

## Authentication

Soutron supports the following authentication methods:

<b>Manual login</b>	Using username & password
<b>ADFS SSO</b>	ADFS acts as the Service Provider, while the client provides the Identity Provider
<b>SAML SSO</b>	Our implementation of SAML means that the client's IdP authenticates against ADFS which acts as the Service Provider, while the client provides the Identity Provider
<b>Oauth &amp; OpenID Connect</b>	Oauth & openID SSO providers such as Google Oauth and IdentityServer can be used.
<b>Custom Web Services</b>	This should be discussed with Soutron to determine if we can connect with a custom web service
<b>IP Authentication</b>	An IP address can be assigned to a users profile, then anybody accessing the system from that IP address will be authenticated automatically as the assigned user
<b>Native Active Directory</b>	This is not possible if the system is hosted by Soutron. The system will connect via LDAP to update and verify a users identity before logging them into the system. Attributes that can be imported can be seen <a href="#">here</a> .
